- International students can enter the school with no prior
 - knowledge of Japanese and reach the standard required to pass the Japanese Language Proficiency Test N1 (the highest level) or N2 before graduation.
- We have international division teachers who are in charge of guidance for international students and Japanese language education.
- There are dormitories, a dining hall, a convenience store, a post office ATM, laundry rooms, baths, and other public areas on campus.
- After graduating from the high school, the students can progress directly on to the attached vocational school on the same campus which has a 100% employment rate. This is the highest in Japan.
- Guidance and recommendations are provided for students to enter many universities in Japan and special guidance is also provided for international students to go on to higher education.



Japan Aviation Academy operates six schools on four campuses. There are three high schools in Yamanashi, Ishikawa and Hokkaido, a junior high school attached to the high school in Yamanashi and two colleges in Ishikawa and Hokkaido. Correspondence courses are also provided. In the long history of the school, which has now reached 92 years, Ishikawa school is a new campus that opened in 2003. As one of the largest full-time high schools in Japan with an aviation department, it fosters human resources who can contribute widely to society and boasts a high employment record through integrated high school and college education. In addition, there is ample support for going on to university and club activities which achieve excellent results in national competitions.

- There are Japanese language courses for all levels of international students.

About Admission



- ${\it O1}$ Is it possible to enter the school without a basic knowledge of Japanese?
- A1 Students can enter the school without a basic knowledge of Japanese. Special Japanese language classes are provided after entering the school.
- Q2 How many people are in the dormitory?
- A2 The boys have a one-person room with a shared bathroom, toilet and bath. The girls have double rooms, each with their own space and two students share a bathroom and toilet.
- **O3** Can I use mobile phones and computers?
- A3 Yes, they can be used. There is wireless Internet access on campus and in the dormitory, so you can use it freely.
- Q4 What should I do if I get sick or have a problem in Japan?
- A4 At school, there are teachers who are responsible for handling students' problems 24 hours a day. If you are sick, you can rest in the health room or be taken to hospital by a teacher.
- **05** Are medical expenses expensive?
- A5 The school pays the National Health Insurance fee for each international student, so you only have to pay 30% of the medical expenses when you go to hospital.
- Q6 Is this school suitable for someone who is not interested in aviation?
- A 6 Our school has added a variety of special courses that can be selected which are based on the general high school curriculum so even if you are not interested in aviation, you can choose either General Studies or Physical Education Arts.
